Policy

Transfer Students:

All normal University policies related to transfer of credit from another institution apply in the case of the transfer of general educational credit.

However, in regard to transfer of general education credit there are additional considerations. It is the policy of the University that incoming transfer students will fulfill the general education course and subject requirement (including at least one course from each of the following areas: humanities/fine arts; social/behavioral sciences; and natural science/mathematics) or reasonable equivalents.

While a course or courses might be accepted for transfer credit, such acceptance for credit does not imply automatic acceptance of a course or courses as fulfilling a part of the University's general education requirement.

All transfer transcripts will be reviewed, and a determination made, about which courses may fulfill part, or all, of the general education requirement, along with any applicable graduation requirements.

Furthermore, incoming transfer students will fulfill the graduation requirement that applies to all students that not less than one third of a student's course work is taken within the general education requirements or equivalents – either at the University or elsewhere.

Distance Education Students:

It is the policy of the University that degree-seeking distance education students (whether first-year or transfer) will fulfill the University's general education requirement.
